he Journey of a Lifetime Session 2:

Experiencing God... A Life Lived

Life is all about experiences. Your personal experiences equal your story.

- A. The journey of our Christian life has the dynamite resource of Christ's Resurrection power to help us live victoriously. (Eph. 1:15-23; Eph. 3:20)
 - 1. As believers, we have power over sin. a. Romans 6:3-10
 - b. Romans 6:11
 - 2. As believers, we have power to live in obedience.
 - a. All the resources of Christ's resurrection power are at our disposal to live in obedience. (Rom. 6:4-5)
 - b. A person can live her new life with the same supernatural power that brought Jesus out of the grave. (Phil. 4:13)
 - 3. As believers, we have power to proclaim the Gospel.
 - a. As promised, Christ's resurrection power was given to all on the day of Pentecost for the purpose of being Christ's witnesses. (Acts 1:8; Acts 2:38-39)
 - b. Christ's resurrection power enables us to boldly and fruitfully proclaim the Gospel with enthusiasm. (Luke 24)

"Witnessing is not something we do for the Lord; it is something that He does through us, if we are filled with the Holy Spirit." (The Bible Exposition Commentary)

- B. The journey of our Christian life inevitably involves suffering.
 - Suffering is not foreign to the Christian who lives her life for Christ. In fact, suffering is an unwelcomed friend. (1 Peter 2:21)
 - a. Fellowship means to share in common.
 - b. "Sufferings" is a common word used for the sufferings of Christ during His trial and crucifixion.
 - 2. Suffering is how we truly get to know our God.
 - a. Through suffering, we begin to understand that there is grace for every place we find ourselves. (2 Cor. 12:9-10)
 - b. Christ gives us our example of how we are to endure sufferings.
 - He did not argue.
 - He did not fight back.
 - He did not revile His accusers after they reviled Him.
 - He committed Himself to His Father and left the outcome to Him.
