

Christ Lives in Me

Galatians 2:20

In Gal. 2:15-16, Paul says that, as believers in Christ, we know that we're *justified by faith*, not by keeping the Law.

Then, in vv. 17-19, he says that, as Christians, we must also *live by faith*, and not go back to law-keeping.

Paul's point in all of this is to remind us that our standing with God is based on one thing, and one thing alone: a relationship with Jesus Christ by faith.

The way we live as believers is rooted in that same reality. Therefore, rather than being focused on following a set of rules, we need to focus on walking with Christ.

Galatians 2:20 ...

1. I am crucified with Christ.
2. Nevertheless I live—yet not I, but Christ lives in me.
3. And the life which I now live in the flesh, I live by the faith of the Son of God ...
4. Who loved me, and gave Himself for me.
